Some people think full moons bring trouble. Some police officers agree. They say they're busier during full moons. Some emergency medical workers say full moon nights are crazier too.

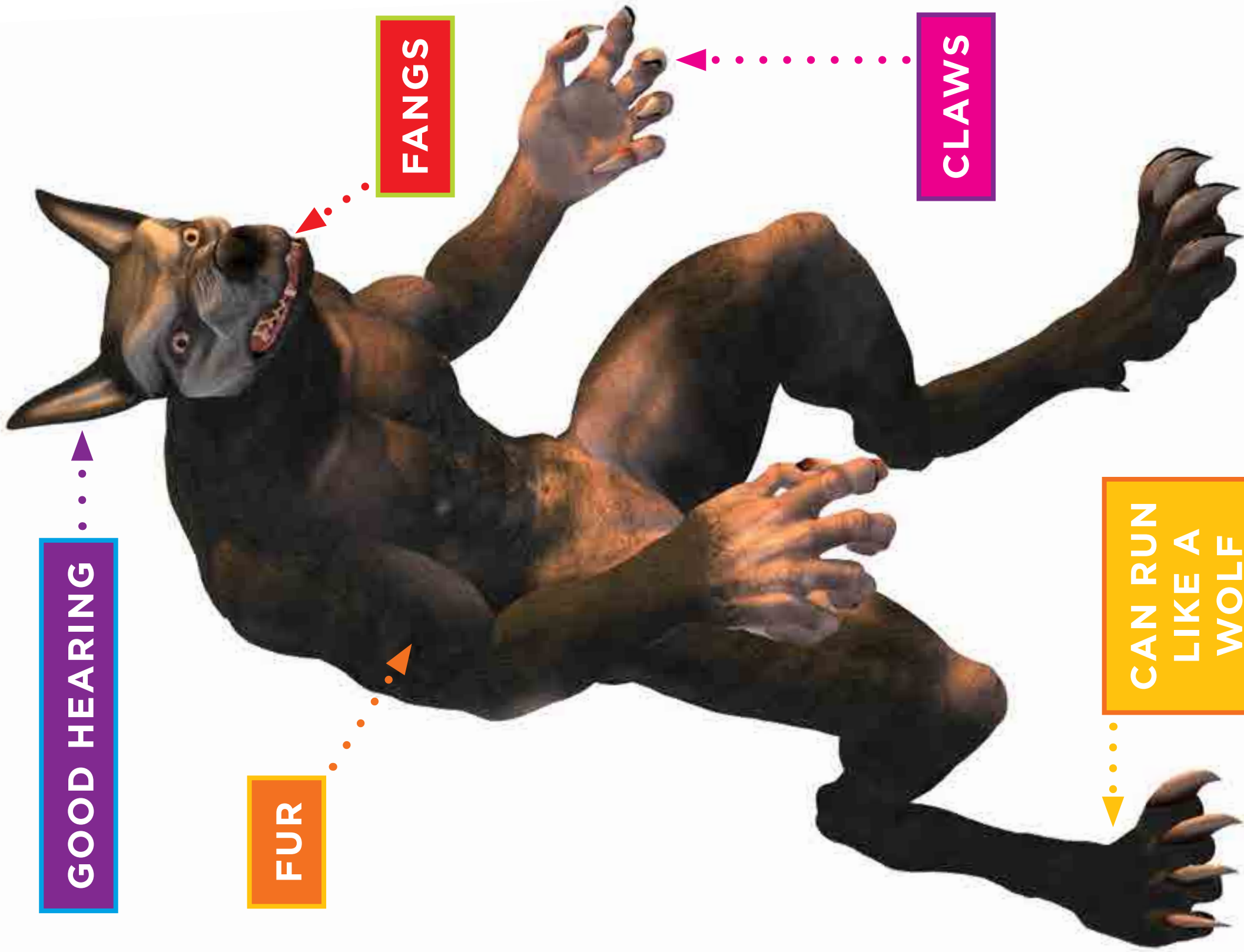
The Curse
